Local children to Yell 'Baa Baa!' with 100,000 other Australians

Author of the new children's book to be read at National Simultaneous Storytime *Pete the Sheep*, Jackie French, says she thinks it's a great idea to have a national storytime. "Just think," she says. "at a certain moment hundreds of thousands of people all over Australia are going to be saying 'Baa! Baa!' How can life ever be the same!"

Local children will be saying the life-changing 'Baa! Baa!' at Mill Park library on Wednesday 27 May, when they join children all over Australia for a simultaneous reading of *Pete the Sheep*. The book tells the story of Shaun the shearer, who, instead of having a sheepdog to help him, has a sheep sheep.

National Simultaneous Storytime is a major highlight of Library and Information Week (25 May – 31 May), which is celebrated every year to highlight the vital role and value of libraries. Last year approximately 110,000 children at over 830 locations took part in the simultaneous reading.

"National Simultaneous Storytime highlights the importance of reading and literacy for children and demonstrates how it can be fun," Yarra Plenty Regional Library Reading and Literacy Coordinator Kerri Pleydell-Sander says.
